#### "CALABASH ELKS UPHOLD ORDER'S 101 YEAR OLD PLEDGE TO VETERANS"

"Veteran's Affairs Committee Honors Veterans of 6 Wars and Campaigns at Appreciation Luncheon"

The following pledge, adopted by the Elks National Service Commission in 1917, shows the commitment the Order has made in serving our Veterans over the past 101 years:

# "So long as there are Veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them!"

Continuing in their tradition of hard work and service to our Veterans, the Veteran's Affairs Committee (VAC) of Elks Lodge 2679 in Calabash, NC, recently upheld the Elks' pledge to Veterans by hosting a "Veterans Recognition Luncheon" and award ceremony for Veterans, as well as their Spouses.

Twenty-One (21) veterans, and many spouses, were served a full-course lunch, planned for and hosted by many of the dedicated volunteer members of the Calabash Elks Lodge's VAC. The purpose of the event was to recognize and show appreciation for, not only the Veteran in the family, but the Spouse as well. In attendance was a Veteran who served in WW II, and the remainder served in Korea, the Cuban Missile Crisis, Vietnam, and Desert Shield and Desert Storm in Iraq. Funding for the event was made possible, in part, by a "Beacon Grant" from the Elks National Foundation, the charitable arm of the order.

Each Veteran was personally "Pinned" with an American Flag/Elks Pin, and presented a Personalized "Certificate of Recognition" for their service, as part of the VAC's on-going "Pin-a-Vet" Program. Additionally, each Veteran who attended the luncheon was awarded one of the VAC's proprietary "VAC ~ 2679 Veteran's Appreciation" Blankets. These blankets, in which the Elks Logo and the words, - "Calabash Elks Veteran's Affairs Committee," are permanently woven into the fabric of a colorful, full-sized, commemorative blanket, are especially appreciated by, and useful to, those wounded and aged veterans.
