"Helping Our Veterans Transition Back In To Civilian Life During the COVID-19 Crisis"

The Veteran's Affairs Committee (VAC) of the Calabash Elks Lodge ~ 2679 recently made a \$3,500.00 donation to the "Veterans Welcome Home and Resource Center" located in Little River, SC. This donation brings the total of Committee donations to the Center to over \$15,500 since 2014. The Elks National Foundation, the Charitable arm of the Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks, provided the funds to the VAC under a special "Beacon Grant" that permits direct donations to organizations supporting needy veterans during the COVID-19 crisis. This grant will allow the Center to financially assist at least seven veterans with rent, utility payments, food, and basic necessities.

As a long-time friend of the lodge, the Resource Center is a private, all volunteer, non-profit South Carolina Corporation unaffiliated with any government agency, including the Veterans Administration. The focus of the Center is helping local Veterans make the necessary adjustments when transitioning back into Civilian Life. They help our Veterans obtain Benefits to which they are entitled; - Provide Job Placement assistance; - Help with obtaining Treatment for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) issues; - Help with Housing needs; - Provide Financial counseling, and - assist with general life adjustment issues.
